Public Safety/Security

- Speeding
 - Not enough posted speed limit signs
 - Community Fundraiser to buy more signs?
 - Contact CHP
 - Consider requesting lowering speed limit in certain areas
 - This is a difficult process
 - o Requesting more patrols
 - o Impact on elders, children, horses, bicyclists
- Fire Safety
 - o Most "fire" calls are medical responses (75%)
 - o More volunteers needed
 - o Add a safety page to MAC website
 - Fire
 - Hazmat
 - Medical
 - Security
 - o Concern over homes in wooded areas
 - No tight controls over homes from County
 - Home with hazardous conditions to be red tagged?
 - o Locked Gates are a problem
- Crime
 - o Concern over lack of full time Sherriff (MCSO) presence
 - How to change this
 - How to increase communications with MCSO

- Increased tourism could bring more drugs, alcohol, prostitution, loitering, homelessness
- o Cannabis related home invasion concerns
- o Drug paraphernalia and CO2 cartridge litter
- o Transients along railroad and river

 - CERT training
 - Does one exist in RWV? If not where is the nearest?
 - Community Alert network
 - o Neighborhood watch meetings and better signage regarding
